- 8. Society vases (SV) will be provided for classes 1, 2, 6, 7, 8 and 47.

- 10. In fruit and vegetable classes mixed cultivars (varieties) are not permitted.

Advice for exhibitors

- Exhibits should be clean and free from pests, disease and blemish.
- Condition, uniformity, size, shape and colour are factors to aim for.
- Bring extra blooms and vegetables in case of damage.
- Flowers are best cut in the evening or early morning leaving the stems as long as possible.
- Each bloom should be clearly seen.
- Fruit should be staged symmetrically on plates.
- Handle all fruits as little and as gently as possible and by their stalks so that the natural bloom is not spoilt.
- Exhibit stone, top and soft fruit with stalks.
- Vegetables should be staged as attractively as possible on plates or direct on the table.
- Exhibit peas and beans with stalks in a line with the tail end facing the front.
- Wash clean any root vegetables leaving 75mm of foliage.
- Courgettes should be approx. 150mm in length and up to 35mm in diameter.
- Do not overdress onions, tie the tops with raffia.
- ♦ Select potato specimens between 200g and 250g with shallow eyes.
- Tomatoes should be ripe with firm, fresh calyces.
